Star #2	Cutting:	
Make 21	Background	(4) 3½" strips; sub-cut at 2" to get (84) rectangles
	Star	(4) 2" strips; sub-cut into (84) squares (2) 3½" strips; sub-cut into (21) squares (6) 2" strips; sub-cut into (168) squares
	Accent	(3) 2" strips; sub-cut into (84) squares

Block Construction:

Star points are made with flying geese sections. On the wrong side of the 2" star fabric squares mark the diagonals. Place one square right sides together on top of a background rectangle. Stitch along the marked diagonal. Trim the outer corner of the star square to approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ ", press out. I like to leave the background rectangle intact. In the event you didn't sew or press exactly right you still have the straight corner of the rectangle to follow when stitching it into the block. Repeat with another square on the opposite side of the rectangle. You will need (4) of these for each block—a total of (84) flying geese sections. Set aside.

Setting The Blocks On Point

In order to sew the quilt in strips you will add (4) triangles to each block. To get the triangles you will need cut the following from each of the path fabrics:

(14) $5\frac{1}{4}$ " X $5\frac{1}{4}$ " ; cut each in half diagonally **once**.
